Articles on both of these tours have been in the Rumble Sheet but time is running out if you want to sign up to participate. From my perspective either option is a great option – sure nice to have such great alternatives.



MAFCA National Tour: Pony Express Tour 2010

MAFCA announces the 150th Anniversary Pony Express Model "A" Ford Tour scheduled for June 19-27, 2010.

Model A Fords and trucks will honor the Pony Express by transversing the original route.

One group of vehicles will leave from Sacramento CA and another from St. Joseph MO and will meet in the middle of the route, Casper Wyoming, on June 23. Any MAFCA member can join in this tour!

Plans are to use GPS devices on a car from each group and track their progress on the MAFCA web site - a first for us.

Bill Harris from the OKC Club has contacted us regarding our participation in the MAFCA National Tour: Pony Express Tour 2010. Currently OKC Club has 6 couples from their Club committed to go on the tour. If you have an interest in joining the group from OKC on this tour please contact Bill Harris at BBHarris@sbcglobal. net or 405-359-0063 as well as look on the MAFCA website. This sounds like a terrific tour and would be fun to link with the OKC club for another joint activity. Based on some brief conversations with some of our members on the Spring Tour some have expressed an interest in participating.

They schedule is as follows: traveling to Riverside, Mo arriving June 17th which is on the North edge of Kansas City. They will spend two nights in Riverside, then go on to St. Jo, Mo. where the tour begins. If this pretour itinerary plan does not fit your schedule you could just meet them in St. Jo, MO. They will spend one night in St. Jo. From there they go to Casper, Wyoming which takes 3 days and about 800 miles. They will spend 2 nights in Casper. There are activities, museum and all kinds of things to see and do along the way. Bill Harris and Bill Jenkins are going to and get hotels along the way so if you decide to go with OKC, you need to try and get the same hotels if possible. They plan on driving their Model A's all the way from OKC to Casper back to OKC.


to have a great vogue in future years." This pattern is circa 1930-31.

Technical Tips/Discussion

Below is a list of items MAFCA (copied from the MAFCA website) suggested carrying to be prepared on a tour. For long distance tours such as fall tour or driving to a Regional Meet it would make sense to divide some of these items between those driving. While the list is extensive several of these items would be considered critical even on short tours. Personally I carry an assortment of tools (open end/box end wrenches, adjustable wrench, pliers, screwdrivers, knife, etc.) as well as a jack and lug wrench and coolant. In terms of parts I have items such as: spare flow tested carburetor, spare distributor, fan belt, water hose, assortment of bulbs, spark plugs, rubber fuel line, thread sealant, etc. What would you consider the most important items to carry?

The following list of tools, parts and supplies is a good checklist when preparing your car for a tour. Why don't you post it in a convenient place in your garage?

Once you're prepared for a tour, you'll feel more comfortable knowing that if a problem occurs, you'll have the tools and the spare parts to repair the problem.

Flashlight
Tube patch kit
Electrical circuit tester
