

# One Thousand Mile Patch by Roy Cail

Time is passing fast toward reaching your 1000 miles goal for 2010. Thought you might be interested in a few statistics for miles driven in 2010. From my perspective this has been a very productive program in terms of encouraging us to drive our A's.

Total Cars Participating: 32
Members Driving 1000+ Miles: 17\*
Members Driving 2000+ Miles: 8 - 10\*
\* Includes estimated miles driven on the Fall Tour (most logged 600+ miles)

The MAFCA 1 Million mile challenge ended September 30. The MAFCA members participating logged 1,606,508 miles from January 1 - September 30 far exceeding the goal of 1 Million miles. The Tulsa Club drove 26,237 miles during this period which were submitted to MAFCA. Each member participating has been awarded a decal that will be distributed at the November 12 Chili Dinner/Auction. In an attempt to wrap up the Tulsa program submit your final odometer reading no later than December 13 to Roy Cail. The plans are to award our dash plates to those driving 1000 miles or greater at the Christmas Party on December 17. This is a busy period of time for all of us and I would appreciate your prompt follow-up on submitting your miles. I am going to depend on your submission of odometer readings and will post miles received by cut off date. Again, please submit odometer readings.






# Frozen Food Sale


