Saturday, October 6, Club Breakfast and Tour of Private Automobile Collection







Tulsa Fly-In at Bartlesville Airport Saturday, September 22

The Tulsa Fly-In is one of the oldest fly-ins in the country and is now held in Bartlesville where it has been conducted the past 20 years. This is the 56th year of the event which began at Harvey Young Airport. It later moved to Okmulgee, then Bartlesville, then the new Riverside Airport, then back to Harvey Young, then Tahlequah and then back to Bartlesville. Cost to the general public is \$7 for adults and \$3 for children. Depending on the weather, the Fly-In normally attracts 100 to 200 airplanes from small Piper Cubs, Aeronca Champs and various other small, light planes through surplus WWII military aircraft such as bi-planes, SNJs, T-6s, and others. There are normally several experimental and light sport planes in the mix as well. The variety is very wide.

There is a pancake breakfast served until 10:00am and is open to the public for a donation. Antique cars are encouraged to come and are parked together and admitted free of admission.

At 10:30am the warbirds are scheduled to



arrive and will be parked on the main ramp for "up-close" viewing along with 10-12 other show-class antique/classic aircraft. At about 1:30pm there will be spot landing and short field takeoff contests which are always entertaining to watch. There are numerous food concessions on the field with covered seating for eating near the parking area for the old cars. There

are also exhibits with various aviation related items and souvenirs.

Last year a 1929 Ford Tri-Motor was the star of the show. Mitch DeCamp won a free ride in it but gave his ticket to his daughter, Audrey, who had never flown in a plane before! She said flying in a Ford for her first flight was quite a thrill.

If you are interested in a drive up to Bartlesville for a fun time, plan to meet at the QT east of Skiatook where Highway 20 crosses Highway 75 at 8:00am on Saturday, September 22. We will then caravan together to the airport, eat breakfast, enjoy the airplanes and then mosey back home around 2:00pm or so.
