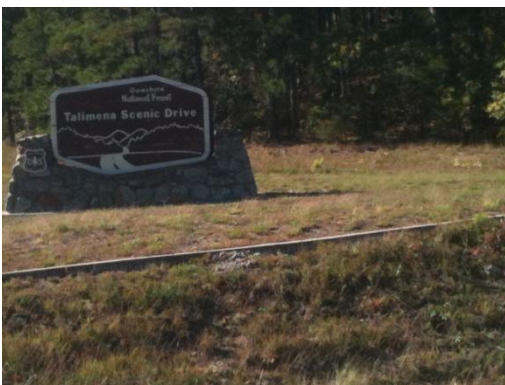




Nuts & Bolts (or Miscellaneous Tidbits!)

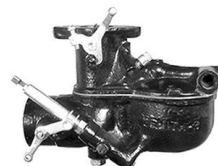
