

## RESTORING A 1929 AA 1 TON EXPRESS

Charlie Ramsey, Ralph Hudson and I started restoring a 1929 AA Express Truck in the summer of 2011. I hope you enjoy following the progress we are making. We have set a goal to have the project completed before the Tulsa Regional in June 2014. We work better under presser. Charlie loves to surf the internet for Model A parts so he found a man in Boise Idaho that wanted to sell the rolling chassis and cab to a AA truck. Charlie wanted the chassis because it had the original AA engine. Charlie bought it and had a transport deliver it to my shop. At that time we did not know just what the end result would be as the truck had no bed. Charlie then determined that he wanted to build an express if possible, so the search began for an express bed. This was very difficult to find and we finally found one in Michigan. It was in bad, bad shape but it was better than nothing and it was expensive.

We took the bed to a body shop in Claremore. There, two young men performed the best job of reconstruction I have ever seen. They went to Ralph Hudson's house and measured the bed on his express truck, taking numerous pictures and using those they reconstructed the bed to the exact specifications. That took over 18 months. The guys are good but not fast. We then needed a tailgate and found that in Claremore. It went to the body shop also. The hardest part has been the spare tire holder. We accidently found one of those at the swap meet in Chickasaw.

During the past two years we have had several brackets, straps, and accessories that we could not find. With the help of Neil Wilson, president of the AA truck club we found a place in California that is fabricating these parts for us. Again, very expensive (\$\$\$). We hope that the fabrication of these parts will be completed soon, so that we can finish the truck on time.


