I missed the Valentine's Day outing with the club due to our trip to Florida. Our brother was renting a home in The Villages, a 55+ active community just north of Orlando and we went to visit and warm up! Amazing place! The development has over 100,000 people, 27 golf courses and is selling 5,000 homes a month! The place is a beehive of activity with golfers, shuffleboard players, Bocce Ball players, tennis players, Pickle Ball players, paddleball players and just about any other game or group activity you can think up. Unbelievable!! And, the kicker is, everyone drives around a golf cart whether they are playing golf or not. They use the golf carts (the locals call them "golf cars") for everything and the development even has separate roads for them.

There was a car show for replica golf cars sponsored by one specific brand, Street Rods, and there were over 100 golf cars in the show. There appear to be four basic models: a 29 Ford, a 34 Ford, a 35 Chevy and a 37 Ford. Each comes in a coupe, pickup or a 4-passenger touring car!

These things are not cheap! They go from \$18,000 for the coupe and pickup up to \$22,000 for the touring car. They have a top speed of about 30 mph but most have installed governors for 20 mph.



The speed limit for golf cars in The Villages is 20 mph and speeding tickets are \$257. One of the 37 Ford replicas had a sign indicating it had a "real V8." But under the hood, it had a bottle of V8 juice!! The hoods function as a lockable ice chest. Later, on our drive down to Miami, we drove through beautiful Palm Beach and counted four Rolls Royces in less than 4 minutes. Can you believe a Rolls every minute?? Cars were definitely on our minds. When we got home, we got Ruthie out and took her for a nice drive!
