We have never needed to beg, twist an arm or threaten to get help











Trash Bash

University Club Tower

University Club Tower, the tallest resident building in Oklahoma was completed in 1966. Two Tulsa architects, Bob Piland and Jack Butz developed the drawings for the tower. I worked for Bob Piland when I first moved to Tulsa in 1974. The 32-floor circular structure was designed in 1964 by the use of a computer.

This was the first major building in the United States designed by a computer-aided program. The head engineer and former instructor at OSU, Fred N. Gauger spent 40 computer hours on the project. He said the design would have taken



four engineers an equivalent of 2 years to complete the work by hand. When you are driving your Model A and see this round apartment building, you will know some of the history of this Tulsa landmark.


