## THINGS YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT ST. PATRICK S DAY

WE SHOULD REALLY WEAR BLUE - Saint Patrick himself would have to deal with pinching on his feast day. His color was "Saint Patrick's blue," a light shade. The color green only became associated with the big day after it was linked to the Irish independence movement in the late 18th century.

SAINT PATRICK WAS BRITISH - Although he made his mark by introducing Christianity to Ireland in the year 432, Patrick wasn't Irish himself. He was born to Roman parents in Scotland or Wales in the late fourth century.

IT USED TO BE A DRY HOLIDAY - For most of the 20th century, Saint Patrick's Day was considered a strictly religious holiday in Ireland, which meant that the nation's pubs were closed for business on March 17. In 1970, the day was converted to a national holiday, and the stout resumed flowing.


# REDEVELOPMENT OF OLD FORD BUILDING IN BRADY DISTRICT By Ken Brust

Universal Ford Motor Company was Tulsa's first Ford dealership. Constructed in 1917, the Ford automobile business at the time was dependent on the railroad to deliver cars from the Ford assembly plants such as the one in Oklahoma City. Universal Ford's Main Street address was ideal because a railroad spur could be laid beside the building and provide a much-needed delivery point right at the dealership. Universal Ford remained at the North Main Street address until 1920 when the owner moved moved the dealership south at a time when other dealerships were beginning to move closer to Route 66 and other highways. The Ford building served several other car agencies until 1932 when it became a warehouse and distribution center for Sears, Roebuck and Company. Sears remained in the building until 1953 when it became a warehouse for the US Army Corp of Engineers for many years. Chris Lilly, architect with Lilly Architects, is redeveloping the Ford building into retail, office and residential space.

## Our Carolyn Turns 98

This St. Patrick's Day, March 17, Carolyn Plucknett celebrates her 98th birthday! This is the same day as our monthly club meeting, so please plan to come that evening and let's have a fantastic birthday celebration for Carolyn!

Carolyn was born in 1917 on a farm in southeastern Nebraska. She was an only child. She grew up in the town of Dewitt, Nebraska, where the famous Vice-Grip tool was invented by a local blacksmith. She and Knoland went through high school and college together although he was one year ahead of her. Carolyn remembers riding in a rumble seat of a Model A when she was a teenager. They were married in 1939, the week she graduated from the University of Nebraska. Her father was a Dodge dealer and presented the new couple with a new, four-door Dodge instead of paying for a big wedding. Carolyn says they drove that car from coast to coast during WWII and a long time afterwards. After their wedding, they went to Washington DC to live. Knoland was an engineer and worked for the Rural Electrical Administration. When war broke out, Carolyn notes, "I wasn't Rosie the Riveter but worked for the Navy because I could type." Knoland and Carolyn moved to Tulsa in 1965. They had two children. Knoland became interested in a Model A after his friend got one, so they joined the club. They had their car restored in Kansas. Don and Jessie Reed later bought their car and are still driving it today.

We are very fortunate and extremely honored to be able to help Carolyn celebrate such an amazing and memorable day in her long life. Happy 98th Birthday, Carolyn!
