

New Member Larry Ross

Many of us think of ourselves as car guys but Larry Ross takes it the next notch higher! While Marvin was helping him recently with his Model A,



Larry shared some interesting car stories that Marvin thought other club members would enjoy even though they don't involve Model A Fords. Many of our club members have T-Birds, Corvettes, muscle cars or other cool or vintage cars making us true car lovers, regardless of the specific vehicle. And who among us doesn't remember going to stock car races on Friday nights? Might we have another John Zink among us?

Larry enjoyed racing and had a 1956 Ford stock car as a senior in high school in 1971. He said he had a total of \$95 in this car and was 4th place in the standings in May. He had to miss one night of racing on Friday to graduate from high school which cost him some points and dropped him down to 10th place. He was fortunate not to miss any more races and finished the year in 7th place winning Rookie of the Year. Larry mentions, "I raced my car for 4 weeks before my parents knew anything about it. My dad was approached by a couple of the guys he worked with who asked if he had a son who raced. He told them no, that his son was still in high school. They



had seen my name in the papers. Dad was a World War II Marine who had fought hand-to-hand combat, so I wasn't going to lie to him when he asked me about racing. Fortunately, he allowed me to continue

racing!" Larry did take some spills and mentions one exciting incident. "One time my '56 Ford took a bit of a ride, flipping 6 times and, on the last 2 rolls, went end over end. It was the only night my mother went to the races and she freaked out even though I walked away from the car untouched."

Larry also has a yellow sprint car. It was raced in Iowa in the 60's, 5 or 6 nights a week, and the owner made a living doing only that. One



could do that back then but soon after the early 70's, racing became much too expensive to make a living at that level. Larry continues, "My 2nd car was a '55 Chevy and, in 1972, I had close to \$300 in this beauty. At such a young age, I attracted a couple of



guys that helped me out a lot. I had a shop in downtown Muskogee that I rented for \$15.00 a month. Just across the alley was a parts store and machine shop. The machinist was

so impressed that I built this Chevy myself, a better built and prettier car than most of the cars that grown men built. He had me take my heads off one Saturday and told me to come see him the next Wednesday. Not sure what all he did to those heads, but that 283 engine became a rocket. He pulled the right front coil spring out of a 1958 chevy station wagon, cut it down to fit and now my car handled in the corner without the body roll you see in the one picture with me on the outside of car #13. Notice how badly #13 looks in the corners next to mine. I finished that season in the #3 spot, a close race among the top 2 and myself, and gained most improved driver that year. I still have the yellow sprint car and the #71 '55 Chevy. I plan to restore the '55 Chevy back like it was when I raced it. I have a '55 Bel Aire 2 dr. body in perfect condition, so the car will look just like it did the first night at the track."
