INTERESTING TULSA AND FORD CONNECTIONS by Ken Brust

In 1939, Henry Ford invited Charles Dilbeck to Detroit. Dilbeck had attended Oklahoma A&M studying architecture but left after a couple of years and in 1929 opened his own architectural practice in Tulsa where he designed and built dozens of Tulsa's early homes for numerous oil barons. Ford had an idea -- he wanted to build homes the way he built his automobiles. assembly-line fashion. He asked Dilbeck to design these houses that were to be a fireproof structure with a steel skeleton framework and stucco walls. Ford also wanted a choice of three styles of architecture to



choose: Colonial, English and Spanish. Henry Ford could visualize his assembly-line houses in large housing developments complete with schools, shops and churches. Each of his "Ford Houses" would come with a new Ford car in every garage. Both the house and the car would be financed with \$35 monthly payments. Unfortunately, the advent of World War II forced Henry Ford to abandon his vision of "Ford Town," when his automobile manufacturing plants turned to building tanks and aircraft.

The latest issue of the MAFCA Restorer has an interesting article on the Noblitt-Sparks Company which produced many parts for the Model A. Its very first product was the hand tire pump. To celebrate the company's success, a bronze sculpture by J. Seward Johnson Jr. was cast of a life sized man using the pump on his Model A. J. Seward Johnson Jr. is famous for his life-size sculptures. Tulsa is fortunate to have one of his bronze sculptures in the lobby of the historic Kennedy Building downtown. Incidentally, if you have never been a member of MAFCA, now is the perfect time to join. If you join now for \$40, your second year's renewal is free! You can thank me later.

VINTAGE ADVERTISING



Dear Sir:—

We're writing this letter to you today because we want to help you get your money out of your Model T.

It's still as good a car as it was the day the new Model A Ford was announced and there's no need to sacrifice it.

The Model T Ford is still used by more people than any other automobile. Eight million are in active service right now and many of them can be driven one, two, three and five years and even longer.

Bring your car to us and let us look it over. You'll be surprised to see how little it costs to put it in tip-top shape.

New fenders, for instance, cost from \$3.50 to \$5.00 each, with a labor charge of \$1.00 to \$2.50. Tuning up the motor and replacing commutator case, brush and vibrator points costs only \$1.00, with a small charge for material. Brake shoes can be installed and emergency brakes equalized for a labor charge of only \$1.25. A labor charge of \$4.00 to \$5.00 will cover the overhauling of the front axle, rebushing springs and spring perches, and straightening, aligning and adjusting wheels.

The labor charge for overhauling the average rear axle runs from \$5.75 to \$7.00. Grinding valves and cleaning carbon can be done for \$3.00 to \$4.00.

A set of four new pistons and rings cost only \$7.00. For a labor charge of \$20 to \$2.00 you can have your motor and transmission completely overhauled. Parts are extra.


