She grew up in DeWitt, Nebraska, home also of the Vise Grip pliers.



In 2013 after six and a half years, Chris DuVall's education finally culminated with two Master's Degrees from The University of Tulsa, and a wonderful job. He can finally make his first major purchase! Most thoughts would probably run to purchasing a home; however, Chris is ready to purchase a new Ford Car. Previously in 2010, Chris had fallen in love with a beautiful 1930 Elkpoint and Kewanne Green Cabriolet his father, Mitchell DuVall, had purchased. Chris can never resist driving the classic car around town



every chance he gets. Hot or cold, it is always convertible weather when in a Cabriolet! Soon afterwards, we all joined The Tulsa Model A Ford Club as well as The Model A Ford Club of America. This started our family's love (or madness depending on who you ask) for Model A's with all of the fun tours, food and comradery that ensues.

Next, our family acquired a 1930 Tudor, and chose to "tear it apart" and start a frame off restoration that would become a father and son project for the next two years. They started by powder coating the frame and wheels, replacing all of the interior and any wood frame parts, rebuilding the engine, transmission and differential. The exterior paint scheme is Lombard Blue and Black with Hessian Blue wheels and pinstripe, which we consider to be very attractive. Naturally, we maintained everything should be kept as original as possible throughout the entire process. The only exception

is the air conditioning that Melody insisted on to combat the hot summer days in Oklahoma, and even that could not permanently alter the car in any way! Between research, grease, labor and test drives, hardly a weekend ensues without a good amount of quality "Model A Time." We have even driven halfway across the country to obtain NOS fenders! Finally, the fully restored Tudor



was finished just in time to make its debut on the fantastic "2015 MATC Yellowstone Tour." We were proud to show off the vehicle while traveling the route of over 3000 miles, and excited to report no mechanical hiccups during the tour. While in Yellowstone, we became quite



convinced that our motorcar was one of the main attractions of the park due to the hoard of people surrounding it and asking questions at every stop. It was quite enjoyable conversing with all of the people; however, we did tire of hearing the phrase, "That can't be an original color since all Model A's were black!"

Shortly after commencing the Tudor restoration, our family acquired the "winter car" which is an original

unrestored 1929 Town Sedan with only 55,000 original miles. Since Mitchell is the owner and operator of DuVall's Transmission in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, the restoration and maintenance of these classic cars is a superb hobby for relaxation. We traversed from Tahlequah, Oklahoma to St. George, Utah to pick up the motorcar stopping on the way home to drive in the upper rim of the Grand Canyon National Park.



Our family's madness of new friendships and laughter will surely continue with the next father and son restoration project, the 1929 Town Sedan, and hopefully a phaeton someday. However, simply restoring a motorcar is not in and of itself enough of a reward. We believe the below quote from a Ford Advertisement described all of us quite accurately. Touring and quality family time is undoubtedly the greatest reward from our family "madness."
