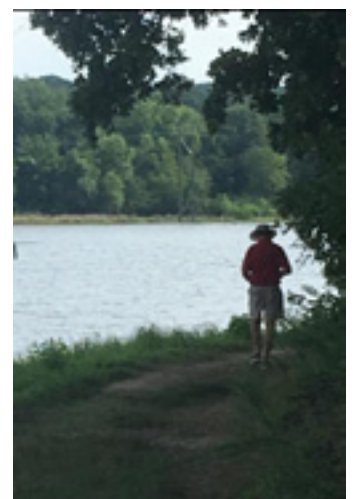
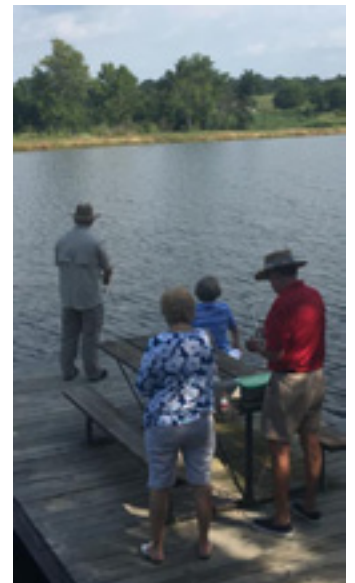

2019 HOLDENVILLE FALL TOUR

The 2019 Fall Tour to Holdenville, Oklahoma is just around the corner. If you are travelling from Oklahoma City or Tulsa, you can take highways, or scenic routes. Oklahoma City members can take scenic Route 66 to Hwy 62 to Okemah for lunch on Thursday. Tulsa members can take Hwy 75 to Okmulgee, then scenic Hwy 62 to meet in Okemah for lunch on Thursday at the Hen House. Ricki, Gary, June and Don will meet you there and escort you to the hotel—the Best Western Plus in Wewoka.

But, what will you be doing, where will you be going and when will all the activities be held, you might ask. An itinerary and registration has been provided on the Club's newsletters telling you everything about the event, but what is in Holdenville??

Did you know that Holdenville is the county seat of Hughes County, or that it has had a post office since 1895. It was originally a Creek Settlement called "Echo". Despite its small size, it has a notable history. It has been home to many famous people—Dave Brown, Seattle Mariner's manager, Jackie Brown, Major League Baseball pitcher, "Dizzy" Dean, Major League baseball pitcher, Jack Jacobs, Canadian Football League quarterback, Richard Jordan, NFL player, Velma Middleton, jazz singer, and yes, Boone Pickens, billionaire oil and gas businessmen. These, among many others, got their start in Holdenville.

The town is located approximately five miles north of the Holdenville City Lake, eight miles north of the Canadian River, six miles north of Little River, and 23 miles south of I-40. The area is mostly wooded and flanked by gently rolling hills. (Great terrain for Model A scenic drives).

Every year, for the last 28 years, the City has held the Fall Festival. It has been called many names over the years—Hog Wild Day was one—and there was a hog calling contest and greased pig contest. In recent years it has included a parade, classic car show, and an open-air market fair with dozens of booths and vendors. Some of the current events include museum tours, wine tasting, and live music.

Holdenville is home to many good restaurants. American, Chinese, Mexican and Italian are here. In addition many fast food, bar-b-ques, and old fashioned diners dot the streets.

If you are planning to attend the Fall Tour, you are definitely in for a fun-filled three days. Or if you can't make all three days, come for what you can and enjoy this town's old fashioned hospitality. We look forward to seeing you here, Oct. 3-6. Please stay safe and healthy until then.
