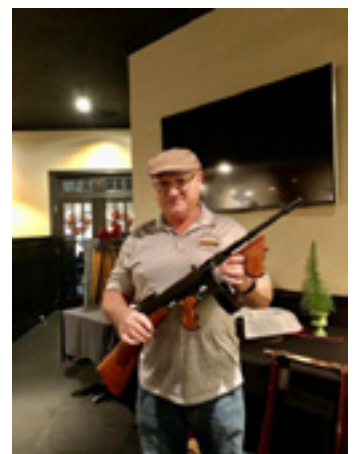

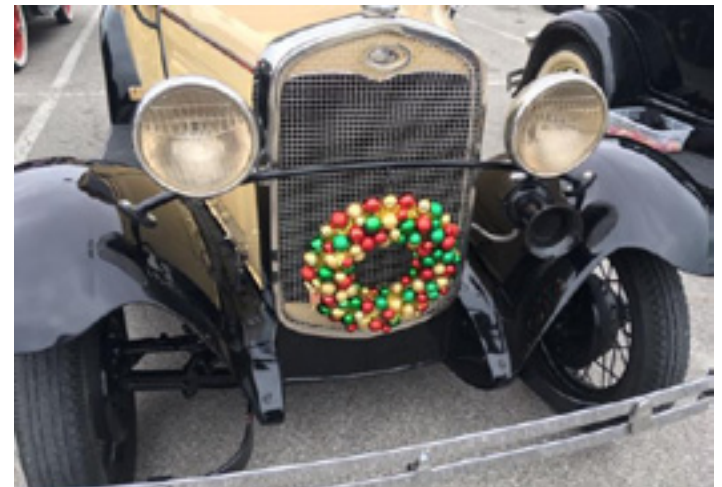

# MAFCA Canyonlands National Tour Kanab, Utah

Have you ever wondered how long you can look at red rock formations before you would say you've seen enough? Well, apparently 21 days isn't the limit!

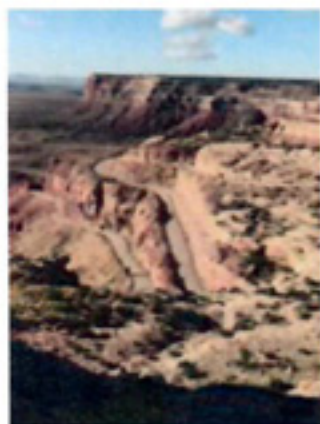
Robert & Elaine Bullard, along with Jim and Illona Blaszczak left home headed for the MAFCA Canyonlands National Tour in Kanab, Utah.

The tour ran October 6-10, but we decided there were too many other things to see out west and we had to see them so off we went.



Days 1 thru 3 were trailering days, but we didn't let that stop us from sightseeing. The OS Ranch Museum, Buddy Holly Center, Waylon Jennings Museum, Painted Desert, Petrified Forest, WigWam Motel, and the infamous "Standing on a Corner" complete with a blond in a flatbed Ford in Winslow, AZ.

We unloaded our cars near Happy Jack, AZ and the fun really began! We drove to Sedona and Jerome, AZ and then began to make our way towards Moab, UT. Soon after leaving Flagstaff we found one of the highlights of our trip: the Walpi Village, the oldest continually inhabited community in the United States. The Hopi Indians have lived at the end of the First Mesa (there's also a Second and Third Mesa), 300 feet above the canyon floor since about 900 AD. They still have no electricity or running water. The villagers we met were as excited to see our Model A's as we were to meet them and learn about their life on the mesa.



We visited Canyon de Chelly, Monument Valley, Gooseneck State Park, Natural Bridges, Canyonlands, Arches, Goblin Valley State Park, Capitol Reef, Kodachrome Basin State Park, Escalante Grand Staircase and Cedar Breaks on our way to Kanab and the national meet. There we met up with about 300 other Model A's and their owners. We got to visit with old friends we don't see often enough and make some new friends. Kanab is a small but friendly town of about 4,500 people and is centrally located for seeing "The

Mighty Five" national parks. The welcome dinner was in a lovely city park, but by the last day it had gotten too cold to dine outside and so the city of Kanab put a rush job on a new facility and in two days had it ready to accommodate over 600 people for dinner!



While in Kanab we got a tour of some old Hollywood western movie locations and visited the Best Friends Animal Sanctuary, Bryce Canyon, Zion, and The North Rim of the Grand Canyon National Parks.



After leaving Kanab we ventured to The South Rim via The Grand Canyon Railway to and from Williams, AZ. After loading our tired girls back into the trailers we stopped to see Carlsbad Caverns on our way home.



We knew that each park or area we saw was formed by wind and water, but how did it all end up shaped so differently? Needles, canyons, arches, windows and hoodoos. They were all so mesmerizing!



We drove dirt roads, both on purpose and accidentally. We stayed in hotels, motels, log cabins and a house. We went for a train ride, a boat ride and a mule ride. While on the train, we sipped champagne, danced in a conga line and were robbed at gunpoint. It turns out if the thieves didn't take your money, the sheriff would! We returned home after 27 days on the road thinking this had to be one of the best vacations ever.



I wish I could say we didn't miss anything, but we did! So...we're going back to catch a few things as we head further down the road. There's red rocks we need to see. Wanna go?
