THE FINER POINTS

We had so much fun at Model "A" Day at the Gilmore this year. It's certainly an event that everyone should try to attend at least once! The museum is spectacular as well as the swap meet. This year, the swap was bigger than ever before, and the volume of parts that were available was astonishing. Most surprising this year was the amount of sheet metal that was available. Some NOS early 1928 fenders were even available, and believe me, it is very rare to see such fenders.

So, what differentiates an early 1928 fender from a later 1928-1929 fender? The easiest way to tell is to look at the curve of the fender near the back of the hood. Below is a photo of the curvature of the early fenders.



Next is a photo of a later 1928-1929 fender. Between these two photos, it is plain to see how the curve changed. Like most of the production changes; this was borne out of necessity. If you had a car with an early fender and you cut the wheels too short, the tire would rub on the inside of the fender.

Ford made this change to the fenders in April 1928, but it took some of the assembly plants a little extra time to use up their inventory. As a result, these fenders can be found on cars that were assembled up through July 1928. On a side note, my original August 1928 Roadster does not have the early style.

There are a few things that are consistent between the early and late style '28-'29 fenders. The first item of note for Fine Point is the spot welds at the rear of the fenders. All '28-'29 fenders had three spot welds across the back; however, the severity differed slightly from fender to fender. The photo at the top of next column shows the typical spot welds the judges expect to see.

Next, the fender reinforcement bracket was spot welded along the outer edge of the fender. These spot welds must also be seen in a fine point fender. Ford made no effort to beautify such imperfections in their body work. At right is a photo of these typical welds. They also vary in size and depth slightly from fender to fender.

In the photo to the right, the knurling is clearly visible. This is a common trait with all Model "A" fenders, and it must be able to be felt during judging. Otherwise, the fender will be considered "overrestored". Hopefully Dad will be able to bring his Roadster to Playday so everyone can try to spot all these little details. Also, don't forget to make plans to be at Model "A" day next year!


SUNSHINE REPORT


