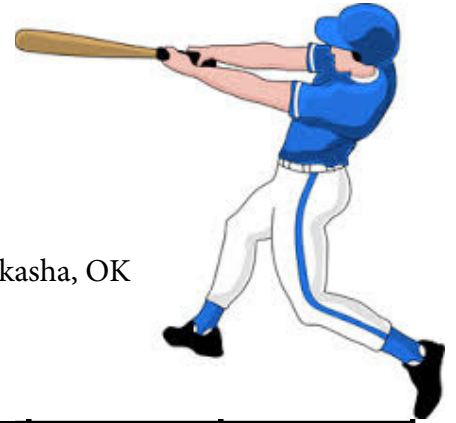

The Finer Points

Swap season is officially upon us! Has anyone found any fantastic bargains for their car? I do enjoy finding original parts for the cars. Even if it is not a show car, I still like using original parts where possible. On open cars, I frequently see reproduction windshield wingnuts used. In truth, original wingnuts are quite common to run across at swaps if you know what to look for, and they can be acquired very reasonably.

So, what do originals look like? Below is a photo of three wingnuts viewed from the side. Can you pick out the original?

Obviously, the one on the right is the reproduction. Now that you know, isn't the reproduction easy to spot? So, what are the differences in the other two? The one on the far left is nickel plated and would have been used in 1928 and 1929. Beginning in 1930, the wingnuts were chrome plated. Below is a photo of the wingnuts viewed from the top.

Once again, it is clear the reproduction falls a little short. Literally in this case since it is shorter than the other two! There were variations in these wingnuts as can be seen between the two originals. So if you have a Roadster and you happen to find yourself at a swap meet, be sure to keep an eye out for original wingnuts!
