

The Finer Points By Chris Duval

We are gearing up to head to Morgantown later this week. I will be judging the brake section, and Dad will be judging the lamps. I know brakes sound boring; however, it is one of the only sections where you get to look at basically the entire undercarriage and the interior of the car.

This past weekend, we made a trip to Wisconsin, and I came back with quite a few new parts. As you all know, I am constantly looking for original parts. One such part I found is an original crankshaft pulley. These seem to be rarely seen anymore. So, what identifies it as an original? The first thing is it doesn't have any casting letters or numbers on it. Snyder's produces a reproduction that is excellent; however, they put the letter "S" in the front.





second telltale sign is the casting "delta" on the back side as seen in the second photo. With few exceptions, original Ford castings have a "delta". This crankshaft pulley will be painted Engine green and installed on a 1931 project I am just starting on. Hopefully as I go along, I will have more updates for you all. In the meantime, if you're looking at a cast piece at a swap meet,

make sure you see the delta before you buy if you're hoping it's original!
