The Finer Points By Chris Duval

We made a very successful run up to Hickory Corners, Michigan to the Model "A" Ford Foundation, Inc. Museum within the Gilmore Car Museum. If you have never been there, I cannot recommend it enough. There are lots of great people, and the museum has an incredible display of cars, clothing, tools, and parts. Of course, my favorite part of the weekend is the swap meet. There is more to the swap meet than just parts! I feel I must give credit (or possibly blame depending on who you ask) for my affection for original Model "A" advertisements to Don House. After acquiring his collection of literature, it seems I am hardly able to go to a swap meet without picking up at least one advertisement. This time, I picked up four ranging from one of the very earliest to mid-1930. Aren't they neat? The one on the far right is actually a centerfold ad.

You never know what will pop up at a swap meet. I also managed to pick up an original Schrader dealer display piece. It's just too bad



is wasn't filled with original valve stems!



Of course, the main thing at any swap meet is car parts, and this year was no exception. NOS fenders were available as well as used fenders. My favorite items were NOS wheels for 1929 and 1930/1931. Naturally, I managed to bring back a few NOS wheels.

Below are two wheels: one 1929 wheel and one 1930/1931 wheel. Aren't they beautiful? One thing that fascinates me is the manufacturing processes Ford used back in the day. A lot of chassis parts were painted with black enamel including the fenders, which were considered part of the chassis and not the body. To paint these parts, Ford elected to dip them in large vats of black enamel paint. As a result, many of these parts ended up with runs and pools of paint. (continued on page 10)





Paint runs and dried paint pools are often found on NOS chassis parts. It goes to show that contrary to popular belief, our beloved Model "A" cars were not perfect when they rolled off the assembly line. They were mass produced as quickly as possible. Nevertheless, Ford did have strict quality controls in place to ensure they were providing the highest value possible to their customers in the low cost field.
