

The Finer Points By Chris Duval

I can hardly believe the end of another year is already upon us. Believe it or not, this is my thirty-fifth "Finer Points" article. Over this time, we've learned a lot about our Model "A" Fords starting with which gear shift knob they originally came out with. Since I'm in a reminiscing kind of mood, let's start our final 2022 article with a question just like we did nearly two years ago. What should the Hood Clip Bumpers look like on most of our cars?

From the beginning of production until April 1931, Ford used round hood clip bumpers. Afterwards, the bumpers on the hood panels were changed to triangular in shape. Since few in our club have a cowl indented car, I'll focus on the earlier style. As I was saying, they were round. Below is a photo of two types of reproduction bumpers available on the market today.



So, which is correct? The diagram in the standards states the bumper should be one half of an inch in length and five eights of an inch wide. Clearly the proportions of the right bumper do not look correct. If you want to use the right one though, a set of them are half the cost of a set of left style at a whopping five dollars. So, let's save the money and get the clearly incorrect part, right? What could go wrong?

This photo shows the problem with that line



of thinking. The bumper is not thick enough and over time it will allow the hood clip to rub on the rolled hood panel edge. The next photo shows a reproduction bumper that is properly installed on a car. Just look

at that clearance between the hood clip and hood! Even though the hood bumper becomes smashed slightly, the clip and hood are very clearly not touching.



I feel like an infomercial... but wait! There's more! Even though the leftmost bumper is the most correct reproduction, it still is not one hundred percent like Henry produced them. Originally, they had a small cloth pad on the back for reinforcement. You may say, "Chris, how could you possibly know this? That's not mentioned in the standards!" I'm glad you asked because I have two examples to prove my claim! First is a complete set of NOS bumpers I picked up awhile back at a swap meet (you seriously have no idea what you will run across at a swap). In the below photo, you can clearly see the fabric reinforcement. How cool is that!

The second example I have is from my original and unrestored 1928 Roadster. You have to look closely, but the fabric reinforcement is there on all six bumpers. It's true a photo is worth a thousand words. This one photo shows the hood alignment next to the cowl, hood clip installation and paint, hood corner pad, and body welting.



So, if you've just finished painting your car, and you're wondering which hood clip bumper to purchase, may I suggest you splurge and buy the \$10 set? That way you won't have to worry about repainting your hood in a couple of years. Paint is expensive!
