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THE FINER POINTS

I finally seem to be making quite a bit of progress on the 400-A with lots of help from Dad. Recently, we were able to pass one of the big milestones of restoring a car: installing the motor into the frame. The motor and frame for my car are a numbers matching set from June 1931, and they have been separated for at least the 38 years Jim owned them. So, it felt like a big deal to finally reunite them. Since Jim owned this car for so long, he was able to collect a lot of new old stock parts. The parts I ran across recently are the two center bumper clamps. There are two since all 400-A's came with front and rear full length bumpers as standard equipment.



The above photo shows the two clamps. They are stainless steel-clad clamps. Originally, they would have been polished to a bright luster just like the bumper clamps. This style was used from 1930 through the end of production. They were most likely a service item for a long time because they seem to pop up fairly often at swap meets. Don't get me wrong though... they are by no means a common find. I found one at the National meet, but did not find any at Model "A" Day if that gives you any indication of rarity.

Let's continue to look at the first photo. The standards state the recesses were painted blue. Obviously, these were painted blue at the beginning of their life. I find it interesting to determine how Ford painted these. It's very easy when we're restoring a car to be over or under critical of our own work. In the case of clamps, it would be easy to assume the paint has to be perfect in the recess, but if you look closely, you can see that it is not. The edges of the paint are not necessarily perfectly straight, and on the right clamp, it looks like not quite all of the upper recess was painted.

After all, Ford produced at least 2.1 million of these clamps to install on production cars made in 1930 and 1931. That does not include when these were sold as service items!

Since the paint doesn't have to be perfect, does that mean the stainless steel doesn't have to be perfect either? Unfortunately, that is not the case. Upon examining the front and the side, it's easy to tell there are not any cracks or dents in the stainless. Those were crimped on by a press, and each one would have exactly matched the one before.

The next photo shows a side view of the clamp including the backing plate, lock washer, and nut. From this view point, you can see some of the details judges look for in the hardware. The nut is an original with a single chamfer on the outer side, and a washer side on the inner side. Additionally, the lock washer is original, and you can clearly see the knurling and square edges. Both the lock washer and nut should be raven finish. The backing plate should be black enamel (glossy black).



The next photo provides a view from the back. It's clear to see the back edges of the stainless were not polished. Why would they? No one can see them!

Also, the back of the clamp and the stud are painted with black enamel paint. Additionally, it's plain to see there is not any pitting in the metal.

Sadly, I ran across these items while looking for something else. Since I'm not quite ready for them, I had to put them back into storage. Wish me luck that it won't be too long before I actually need them!
