# The Finer Points

Recently, it's been an exceptionally busy time; however, I have still managed to squeeze in some time for the wonderful motorcars. Last weekend, I decided it was time to finally replace the tires on my 1931 DeLuxe Roadster. They were on the car when I purchased it in May of 2014, and I have put around fifteen thousand miles on them! Naturally, I decided

to go back to blackwall tires to give the car a more factory look. Personally, I think it gives a more authentic sports car look since that is what it most likely would have had back in the day.

Over the nine years I have owned my '31 Roadster, I have slowly been collecting original parts for Roadsters. This includes door handles, top prop knobs, top irons, and mirrors. Roadsters and Phaetons have a lot of parts that are specific to those body styles, and

good original stuff is not always readily available. As a result, it takes a long time to collect correct original parts especially if you have a lot of reproduction parts to replace!

Okay, enough about future projects... what are we working on now? The two chassis are ready for the engine splash pans. Naturally we have gotten the hardware ready. Originally, the bolts were ¼"-28 hex head bolts with square nuts. The finish on the bolts changed three times throughout production. For our

1929 Special Coupe, the bolts were unfinished. By mid-1931, the bolts were raven. As you can see in the below photo, the earlier bolts were drilled for cotter pins. After mid-1929, Ford changed to lock washers. Also, can you see the knurling on the lock washer? The square nuts were unfinished throughout production.

So, if you happen to run across these at a swap meet, pick them up and fix them for your car.

Hopefully you already have the splash pans!
