The Finer Points

I do not know what it has been like for you all, but this past month has been super busy for me and has just flown by! Nevertheless, I have managed to squeeze in a little of Model "A" time. At the MARC national swap meet last year, I ran across something rather cool: a luggage rack for a DeLuxe Phaeton. Yes, they are different from other racks. Naturally, I purchased it so I would have the excuse of needing to purchase a DeLuxe Phaeton to go with the rack. Who wouldn't, right?

Speaking of the DeLuxe luggage rack, you know the chrome style with the wood slats, right? Did you know the slats were not originally wood, but instead they were woodgrained metal? We recently replaced the slats on Dad's Cabriolet rack, and you can see how different the original ones look.



Don't the original slats just give a better more correct look?



Believe it or not, these slats or complete original luggage racks do pop up occasionally at swap meets. Most of the time, they require a complete restoration. Not everyone is as lucky as Dad to find restored slats at a swap meet! Ha!

I have decided to have an accessory luggage rack on the 400-A, and so I had the slats for my rack restored. Below is a detailed photo showing what the grain should look like. Wood-grained pieces came from the factory with a slightly satin appearance because Ford did not take the time to rub out trim pieces.



This grain pattern is called "Mahogany", and it was used for nearly all woodgraining on the Model "A". This includes window trim and dashes on the DeLuxe cars. You may be wondering if there is another type of woodgraining used on a Model "A", and the answer is yes. "Walnut" woodgraining was used only on the 400-A Convertible Sedan. Below is a photo of the restored dash for my 400-A project. Wish me luck that I will be able to install it soon!


