THE FINER POINTS


It's hard to believe June is already upon us! Soon it will be time for the national meets. Of course, we are planning to go to the MARC National in Hamilton, Ohio, and we are looking forward to the swap! Lately the weather has been perfect for motoring. In case you missed it, I took a joyride earlier this week in my 1929 Phaeton, and I ended up making the front page of the Tulsa World! We should be out motoring in our cars taking full advantage of the beautiful weather we have been having. People love the Model "A" cars. Is there a better way to recruit for our club than by being out driving? The cars need to be driven! So, get out and go for a drive. Who knows, you might even make the front page too!



Recently, an original and unrestored September 1928 car came up for sale. Original and unrestored may be my favorite type of car. (Although I do enjoy the restored cars very much. So, it may be a tossup.) Since I have an original and unrestored 1928 Roadster, I decided to compare to see what is different between the two motorcars. The first thing that stuck out to me was the generators. Did you know that generators and starters were attached to the engine before stamping? That means both parts had to be produced before the motor was tested.

Let's start by looking at my generator below. The feature that sticks out the most is the cutout that is on the side. My generator is the second-generation powerhouse or "P2". According to the standards, the P2 generator was produced from December 1927 through July 1928. It was used for an additional two months through September 1928. Since my Roadster's engine was stamped in August of 1928, the generator must have been produced in either July or August. So,

it fits perfectly. Additionally, you can see the special adjusting arm and bracket used only with the P1 and P2 generators. Henry saved the cost of these brackets afterwards!



The next photo is of the September 1928 car. As you can see, the cutout is in its most common spot: on top of the generator. That most likely makes this generator a third-generation powerhouse or "P3".

According to the standards, the P3 generators were used from October 1928 through July 1929. Uh oh, did you catch the issue? An October generator on a September motor. Remember the generator was installed on the motor prior to stamping. Therefore, the generator should have been produced in either August or September. If you look closely, an adjusting arm can be seen. So, perhaps this is a P1 generator. Unfortunately, that doesn't help our situation because those went out of service in December 1927, and it's highly unlikely any stock would have still been around in late 1928 after some 400,000 cars had been produced. Ford generally kept two months' worth of parts on hand.



To be honest, my best guess is the generator had to be changed at some point. Nevertheless, it doesn't change how cool this original and unrestored car is. It has survived for 93 years. Just think about how cool that is! The overwhelming majority of the cars we see have been restored. Some have probably even been restored two or three times! Survivor cars are special because they give us a glimpse into how the motorcars were actually assembled. So, don't judge them too harshly because the paint might not be shiny or the fenders might be dented. After all they may end up speaking to you like Yoda and say, "When 93 years old you reach, look as good, you will not."


