THE FINER POINTS

Model "A" Days at the Gilmore was a great success! If you're looking for parts, the national swap meets are the place to be. You never know what you'll find. There were NOS fenders available as well as a number of NOS smaller parts. As always, there was a great variety of used parts.

We're continuing to make progress on the Convertible Sedan, and it's getting close to time to install my engine splash pans. So, how do I know I'm installing the correct ones? Below are examples of two driver's side pans: one used and one NOS. The one on the left is correct for November 1929 through June 1930. The one on the right is correct for June 1930 through end of production.



You might be looking at these thinking, "What's the difference?" The one on the right has an extra hole that was only added after June of 1930. This hole was only used on "AA" trucks. Other than that, they are exactly the same. Below is a photo of the extra hole on the NOS pan. Isn't that original paint just gorgeous? I supposed if you were desperate, you could probably find a way to add the extra hole to the one on the left.



Below is a photo showing the bottom side of the NOS late pan. You can also see the proper shape of the pan from this angle. It is not round all the way to the front like the reproductions are.



Anyway, let's move on to the passenger side splash aprons. It's abundantly clear one of these has had fuel drip on it while the other has not. You guessed it, the extra hole is present on the right pan and not on the left one. So, the same dates must apply, right? Actually, the tailpipe cutout is larger than normal on the right pan which means it is a December 1931 pan. Isn't that interesting?




You might be looking at the left pan, and thinking what's going on there? Below is another view. At first glance, it looks like the pan has been damaged and repaired. However, it's a little too nice for that. I believe it was made this way. In the photo on page 4, you can see how the paint "pooled" on that ridge when it was dipped at the factory. Anyway, it's certainly an interesting piece. Now I just have to hide it from Dad so it doesn't end up on his Cabriolet!

NUTS & BOLTS

As I browsed through old issues of our national magazine, I recently discovered an interesting bit of trivia. Did you know where the name for our MAFCA magazine came from? Originally, in 1956, the national Model A Ford organization was called the Model A Restorers Club of Southern California and "Restorer" was used for the name of the magazine. Even though it was a national organization, some folks in Michigan thought the new organization was focused too much on the west coast and California. They led a split and in 1957 they kept the MARC name with its base now in Michigan and then the group based out west became MAFCA. Who knew? (Thanks to our MAFCA President Robert Bullard for this clarification!)

I also came across an interesting article about a competition among various clubs trying to get the largest gathering of Model A Fords. It began as a simple challenge by the Santa Clara Valley, California Chapter of MAFCA. In 1984, it set a record by having 72 Club Model A's at a single event and issued a





challenge to all other MAFCA Chapters to beat it. The Wisconsin Chapter immediately gathered 104 cars and claimed the title, only to learn on the very next weekend the Fort Worth, Texas Chapter had amassed 124 of their club's cars. The challenge spread to other parts of the country with the Colorado Chapter assembling 135 cars which was soon bettered by the Evergreen (Washington) Chapter's 142. Again, on

the very next day, Fort Worth gathered 147 cars to reclaim the title. Wisconsin began a fullscale assault on what they dubbed the "Texas Challenge." They produced 254 Model A's and laid claim to the title of "Model A Capital of the World." Then in 1990, only six years after the initial California challenge was initiated, the Dallas Model A Ford Club celebrated its 30th Anniversary and proudly captured the title by amassing 291 Model A Fords from fellow club members. The resulting photograph made the cover of the Restorer November/December 1990 issue. It reminded me of some of the interesting photographs many of us have organized here in Tulsa or participated in over the years with multiple gaggles of Model A Fords.

With the 100th anniversary coming up for Route 66 in 2026, our Club has been asked to participate in the anniversary preparations. Ken Busby is one of the organizers of the festivities. He has previously presented a program to our club and will be looking for our support. Any ideas?? Word from our men's coffee group is that MAFCA is also asking our Tulsa Club to help organize/support a Route 66 celebration along with a California club. It could be a busy and exciting time during the next few years with



the 100th anniversary of the Model A
Ford coming right behind the Route 66
celebration! Hold on to your hats!!
The new movie, "Killers of the Flower
Moon" is due to be released here soon.
Since Mel had an inside peek during
filming and had his Model T in the
movie, maybe we need to have him
give a presentation sometime about his
experience with the Hollywood folks.


