#### THE FINER POINTS

Wow, this month has flown by! Especially since we vacationed for half of it. As you might imagine, there has not been a lot of Model "A" time this month, but I was able to get one of the roadsters out for a drive recently. Also, I've managed to sneak in a few drives in Dad's Victoria. That's definitely a fun one to drive!

To me, Victorias feel sportier than most other body styles. It must be because of how much further down you sit in the car with the shorter roofline and dropped steering column. Since this Victoria was produced in late 1930, it uses the special spacer between the normal steering column support and the column. Originally it would have been painted the same color as the gas tank. This spacer was introduced with the DeLuxe Phaeton in mid-1930, and it was used through May of 1931.

There were only three body styles that used this two-inch spacer: DeLuxe Phaeton, Victoria, and Convertible Sedan (400-A). Of course, my 400-A that I've been working on does not use this spacer because it was built in June of 1931. So, it uses the next generation of the part which was the extended bracket that bolts to the dash panel. When this bracket was introduced, they were all dipped in black enamel except for the brackets installed on the Convertible Sedans which was painted lower body color.

Of course, most cars have the original design for the support bracket. Below is a photo of the support on our 1929 Special Coupe. This provides a great view of the correct anti-rattler which was black, cloth reinforced rubber with chamfered ends.

The May breakfast will be at the Tulsa Silver Skillet but no miniature golf; all are closed.


President Cail solicited a leader for the Sept. 20th Play Day at Asbury Methodist Church!

Meet at the Inola High School parking lot at 9:30 am. Depart at 10 am heading E on old OK Hwy 33 ( W 590 Rd) towards Locust Grove. In Locust Grove, turn L (N) on OK Hwy 82. Turn R (E) on Kenwood Road, towards Kenwood. Continue E through Kenwood, then turn L (N) at the sign for the Spavinaw Wildlife Management Area. Drive through the wildlife area to the town of Eucha, OK. In Eucha, turn L (N) and drive to OK Hwy 20. Turn L (W) on Hwy 20, then R (N) on OK Hwy 28 stopping at Cosby's Catfish Restaurant on the right, for lunch. We have reservations

at 1 pm. Cosby's has great catfish and all the fixin's served family style. They have other items on the menu, if you choose.



After

lunch, turn R (W) out of the parking lot onto OK Hwy 28 towards Tia Juana and Disney, OK. 

## FROM DECORATION DAY TO MEMORIAL DAY

- **Civil War Legacy:** Following the Civil War, many communities already had traditions of decorating graves with flowers to honor the fallen.
- Grand Army of the Republic (GAR):
- The GAR, a veterans organization, played a key role in formally establishing Decoration Day.
- **General John A. Logan:** As the Commander-in-Chief of the GAR, General John A. Logan issued a proclamation declaring May 30th as Decoration Day, urging people to decorate the graves of Union soldiers.
- **First National Observance:** The first large-scale observance of Decoration Day took place at Arlington National Cemetery in 1868, with over 5,000 people attending.
- Evolution to Memorial Day: While Decoration Day became widely observed, the name Memorial Day began to be used in the decades following World War I as the holiday broadened to include all fallen American soldiers.
- **Formalization as Memorial Day:** Congress officially recognized Memorial Day as a national holiday in 1971.
