We had other Board of Director members who assisted Tim that made the tour run smoothly. Great team effort. Speaking about tours, the OK Sooners Club is responsibility for the Fall Tour. They have selected October 16 – 19 as the date. They are just starting to put together the agenda which will influence the location of the hotel. As soon as we have the hotel we will publish so you can make your reservations.

"The E.W. Marland Mansion is a 43,561 square feet (4,046.9 m2) Mediterranean Revival-style mansion located in Ponca City, Oklahoma, United States. Built by oil baron and philanthropist Ernest Whitworth (E.W.) Marland, as a display of wealth at the peak of the 1920s oil boom, the house is one of the largest residences in the southwestern United States, and is known as the "Palace on the Prairie." It was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1973, and is now a museum open to the public."







This mansion was Marland's first mansion in Ponca City, built just before WWII. It featured Oklahoma's first indoor pool, air conditioning, and central vacuum. E.W. Arlan's was an oilman, 10th governor of Oklahoma and a US Representative.














Known for its rare stained glass windows, this 1910 French Gothic-style Catholic church was the principal church of the Osage Tribe. Now known as the Immaculate Conception Church, the Cathedral of the Osage in Pawhuska features twenty-two stained glass windows that visitors can admire.











The elegant Poncan Theatre in Poncan City, Oklahoma opened its doors on September 20, 1927. The Poncan Theatre cost \$280,000 to build – about \$4.1 million today.
